Service of Praise and the Celebration of the Lord's Supper

Opening Prayer

Choir: *“An Easter Call to Praise”*

P: Our Lord lives! He is alive! He has defeated death! He has defeated Satan! He has defeated sin and every evil! He has declared victory on our behalf. He has Risen! He has renewed us all in His loving grace and Resurrection.

C: *He has Redeemed the world. He has paid the price for all sin. He has given us life, because He is alive! He has Risen! He has Risen Indeed! Our Lord and Redeemer Lives!*

Invocation: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **C:** *Amen*

P: Our Lord, the Messiah, has defeated death. **C:** *He has Risen! He has Risen indeed!*

P: Jesus rose under the blessing and will of His Father **C:** *He defeated death, hell, and Satan.*

P: He came into this world **C:** *That we might have life, that we may have it abundantly!*

P: He came to honor His Father **C:** *He came to set us free from our sins and grant us life.*

P: Jesus has Risen! He rose that we might have life **C:** *He rose that we would be His forever.*

P: Our Lord and Christ has Risen! **C:** *He has Risen Indeed!*

Confession and Absolution:

C: *Most merciful God, we confess that we are by nature sinful and unclean. We have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved You with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We justly deserve Your present and eternal punishment. For the sake of Your Risen Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in Your will and walk in Your ways to the glory of Your Holy name. Amen.*

P: Almighty God in His mercy has given His Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of the Risen Lord and Christ, and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Hymn: *“I Know that My Redeemer Lives” 461 vs. 1-3*

Introit: *Psalm 118: 19-29*

P: Open for me the gates of righteousness; **C:** *I will enter and give thanks to the Lord.*

P: This is the gate of the Lord **C:** *Through which the righteous may enter.*

P: I will give You thanks, for You answered me; **C:** *You have become my salvation.*

P: The stone the builders rejected **C:** *Has become the capstone;*

P: The Lord has done this, **C:** *And it is marvelous in our eyes.*

P: This is the day the Lord has made; **C:** *Let us rejoice and be glad in it.*

P: O Lord, save us; **C:** *O Lord, grant us success.*

P: Blessed is he who comes **C:** *In the name of the Lord.*

P: From the house of the Lord **C:** *We bless you.*

P: The Lord is God, **C:** *And He has made His light shine upon us.*

P: With boughs in hand, **C:** *Join in the festal procession up to the horns of the altar.*

P: You are my God, and I will give You thanks; **C:** *You are my God, and I will exalt You.*

P: Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; **C:** *His love endures forever.*

ALL: *Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.*

Easter Collect: Almighty God, through Your only-begotten Son, Jesus Christ, You overcame death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life. We humbly pray that we may live before You in righteousness and purity forever; through the same Jesus Christ, our Risen Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **C:** *Amen.*

P: We are forever in His grace. We are forever in His blessing! We are forever in the loving hands of the Father. We live in the hope that will never die! We live in the assurance of His promise! We live in the goodness of His kingdom.

C: *We will never know death! We will never suffer the punishment of our sins! We will never be separated from the loving grace and mercy of our Lord!*

Hymn: "Alleluia, Alleluia Hearts to Heaven" 477

O.T. Lesson: *Exodus 15: 1-11 Then Moses and the people of Israel sang this song to the Lord, saying, "I will sing to the Lord, for He has triumphed gloriously; the horse and his rider he has thrown into the sea. The Lord is my strength and my song and He has become my salvation; this is my God, and I will praise Him, my father's God, and I will exalt Him. The Lord is a man of war; the Lord is His name.*

Pharaoh's chariots and his host He cast into the sea, and his chosen officers were sunk in the Red Sea. The floods covered them; they went down into the depths like a stone. Your right hand, O Lord, glorious in power, Your right hand, O Lord, shatters the enemy. In the greatness of Your majesty You overthrow Your adversaries; You send out Your fury; it consumes them like stubble. At the blast of Your nostrils the waters piled up; the floods stood up in a heap; the deeps congealed in the heart of the sea. The enemy said, 'I will pursue, I will overtake, I will divide the

spoil, my desire shall have it fill of them. I will draw my sword; my hand shall destroy them. You blew with Your wind; the sea covered them; they sank like lead in the mighty waters. Who is like You, O Lord, among the gods? Who is like You, majestic in holiness, awesome in glorious deeds, doing wonders?"

P: God His given us salvation through: His gift of grace, His gift of faith, and His gift of Holy Baptism. We are and will be forever His chosen people: through our Lord's resurrection. We have life. We have life abundantly. We have life forever!

C: *We celebrate His gift to us in Rising from the Dead! We celebrate His defeating death and Satan! We celebrate our eternal hope given because He has Risen indeed!*

Choir: *"The Glory of he Cross"*

Epistle Lesson: *I Corinthians 5: 6b-8 Do you not know that a little leaven leavens the whole lump? Cleanse out the old leaven that you may be a new lump, as you really are unleavened. For Christ, our Passover Lamb, has been sacrificed. Let is therefore celebrate the festival, not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.*

P: We are the holy people of God who are cherished by our Heavenly Father! We are the holy people of God who were purchased by our Lord's blood on the Cross! We are the holy people of God through the work and grace given us through the Holy Spirit!

C: *We are His holy children. We are His heirs to His kingdom! We are His own body of believers bound in grace forever! We are the "Body of Christ", the Church of God on earth!*

Hymn: *"The Strife is O'er, the Battle Won" 464*

Gospel Lesson: *John 20:1-18 The Empty Tomb Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put Him!" So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. Then Simon Peter who was behind him and went into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, as well as the burial cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' head. The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linen. Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.)*

Then the disciples went back to their homes, but Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb and saw two angels in white, seated where Jesus' body had been, one at the head and the other at the foot. They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?" "They have taken my Lord away," she said, "and I don't know where they have put Him." At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. "Woman," He said, why are you crying? Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking He was the gardener, she said, "Sir, if you have carried Him away, tell me where you have put Him, and I will get Him." Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward Him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher"). Jesus said, "Do not hold on to Me, for I have not yet returned to the Father. Go instead to My brothers and tell them, 'I am returning to My Father and your Father, to My God and your God.'" Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news: "I have seen the Lord!" And she told them that He had said these things to her.

P: Our Lord Lives! Therefore: We will stand in His presence before His heavenly throne; We will bask in His loving grace forever; and we will live each day in the comfort of His love and His blessing of forgiveness!

C: *We are now and will forever be His own! We are now members of His everlasting kingdom! We are now standing in the assurance of our Lord's eternal life! We are now equipped to share the Gospel and bring before others the everlasting hope in our Savior!*

Confession of Faith: *Nicene Creed (back of Hymnal)*

Hymn: "Messiah Hymn" (tune 932)

WHAT THE SCRIPTURES TEACH CONCERNING THE LORD'S SUPPER

In I Corinthians 11 the Holy Spirit led Paul to write, "This is my body" and "This cup is the new covenant in my blood" to explain the spiritual truth of the Supper: Christ is truly present in His body and blood in the bread and wine. This is a mystery, a Heavenly gift; one we can only understand in faith. Paul further says, "Therefore whoever eats the bread and drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner, shall be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord" and, "let a man examine himself...for he who eats and drinks, eats and drinks judgment to himself if he does not judge the body rightly." There is no doubt from our Lord's Word, we are receiving His body and blood. The Father offers us forgiveness, unity of faith, strengthening of faith, etc.; it is never our right, we approach His altar only by His invitation. If you are visiting we ask that you please speak with the Pastor before receiving the Lord's Supper. We strive to lovingly carry out our responsibility to ensure the supper remains a blessing for all, never a curse. May His richest blessing be upon you all.
